Rev. David's Quote of the Week



Feminist theologian Isabel Carter Heyward (b. 1945) wrote: "We touch this strength, our power, who we are in the world, when we are most fully in touch with one another and with the world. There is no doubt in my mind that, in so doing, we are participants in ongoing incarnation, bringing god to life in the world. For god is nothing other than the eternally creative source of our relational power, our common strength, a god whose movement is to empower, bringing us into our own together, a god whose name in history is love."

In this season when it is so hard to be "fully in touch with one another"--when it actually feels risky and requires surmounting challenges--we may find ourselves reminded of how precious that connection is, or we may find ourselves trying to discount its importance. There's danger that we'll starve ourselves of connection because of the risk or the challenges, but our power to be in relationship remains our most direct connection with the source of all life and creativity. May we continue to seek and find ways to stay in touch.
