Rev. David's Quote of the Week

American philosopher Martha Nussbaum (b. 1947) writes:

"To be a good human being is to have a kind of openness to the world, an ability to trust uncertain things beyond your own control, that can lead you to be shattered in very extreme circumstances for which you were not to blame. That says something very important about the condition of the ethical life: that it is based on a trust in the uncertain and on a willingness to be exposed; it's based on being more like a plant than like a jewel, something rather fragile, but whose very particular beauty is inseparable from that fragility."

Now is a testing time for our ability to trust uncertain things beyond our control. On so many levels, we are living in a time that asks much of us, and our ethical lives need both nurture and deep grounding in the things which we trust most. Above all, this is a time for us to drink deeply from the wellsprings of our faith community. May we be present for one another in any way we can, as we're needed; may we remember to ask when we need encouragement and support. May the wisdom of a living tradition that witnesses the transcending mystery and wonder of life and the power of love, and calls for justice, equity, and compassion in the interconnected web of humankind and all existence, be a source of strength and hope for you and for us all.
